Euro 2004

Over 7 billion people will watch the 31 matches played between 12th June and 4th July. To bring this into the classroom why not focus on:

- **The UEFA and ICRC (the International Committee of the Red Cross) joint campaign to Protect Children in War.** Their aim is to raise public awareness of the needs of children suffering the terrible effects of hostilities and war. The Olympic Games

Much is being made of the work going on in Athens to prepare for the Olympic events. But what about the work going on in other countries, to meet the huge orders for sportswear associated with the Games? The sportswear industry is geared up to make maximum profits by giving us what we want, when we want it – giant sportswear brands are violating the rights of thousands of workers in Asia, Eastern Europe, Africa, and Central America in order to get the latest sportswear into the shops in time for the Athens Olympics. This unfair trade behind the Games is far from the Olympic ideal of fair play. The Play Fair at the Olympics Campaign – launched by Oxfam, TUC, and Labour Behind the Label, calls on sports brands and the Olympic movement to improve labour standards in the sportswear industry.

“If hypocrisy and exploitation were an Olympic sport, the sportswear industry would win a medal” says Junya Yimprasert from the Thai Labour Campaign, a partner of Labour behind the Label. “The industry is sacrificing human rights in the search for profits. Should the race to kit out athletes mean a race to the bottom for these workers?”
